Workshop Tasks

1. How to grasp the opportunity? - positive risks in the mining industry (top 5).
2. What does an effective Compliance Program in the mining industry look like?
3. Strengths and weaknesses of the European raw materials sector.
4. Strategic resource flows. What is the EU missing the most to build a Green Deal?
5. Indicate which trends in economic development will affect the world economy (3-5 trends) and which of them will be the greatest challenge for the raw materials and mining industries in the coming years.
6. How to stimulate innovation in the mining and raw materials industry to make it more sustainable – identify key technologies, industries, r & d and indicate how best to develop cross-industry cooperation (1-2 proposal).
7. Based on examples indicate the biggest differences in risk evaluation of the exploration project in developed and developing countries.
8. Assessment of the selected project with the use of SWOT analysis (Sulmierzyce stratified deposit, Poland or Taca Taca porphyry project, Argentina).
